Know all men by these presents, that we, Elisha Shucker, John Rickpatrick and wife, wife of John Rickpatrick, of the county of Adams and State of Illinois, are held and firmly bound unto the People of the state of Illinois, in the sum of **One hundred** dollars, current money of the United States, which payment well and truly to be made and performed, we, and each of us, bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, jointly, severally and firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals, this **14<sup>th</sup>** day of **June**, **1832**.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if the said **Elisha Shucker**, administrator of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of **James Shucker** deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, which shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of him the said **Elisha Shucker**, as such administrator ; or to the hands of any person or persons his heirs, and the same or made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, in the Court of Probate for the said county of **Adams**, agreeably to law, and such goods and chattels, do, well and truly administer according to law, and all the rest of the said goods and chattels, rights and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the court of probate, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons, respectively, as may be legally entitled thereto, and the same doth remain, paid and delivered, to all the rest of the debts and expenses thereon incurred by the said deceased, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any just will and testament was made by the deceased, and the same be proved in court, and letters testamentary or of administration be obtained thereon, and the said **Elisha Shucker**, do, in such case, on being required thereto, render and deliver up the letters of administration granted to him as aforesaid, and shall in general, do and perform all other acts which may at any time be required of him by law; then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Witness hands and seal , this 14th day of 1823 The condition of the above obligation is such , that if the said Elisha Tucker administrator of all and singular the goods and chattels , rights and credits of James Tucker deceased , do make , or cause to be made , a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels , rights and credits of the said deceased , which shall come to the hands , possession or knowledge of him Elisha Tucker as such administrator ; or to the hands of any person or persons for him , and the same so made , do exhibit , or cause to be exhibited , in the Court of Probate for the said unto agreeably to law , and such goods and chattels , do , well and truly administer according to law , and all the rest of the said goods and chattels , rights and credits , which shall be found reupon the account of the said administrator , the same being first examined and allowed by the court shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively , as may be legally entitled thereto ; and further to make a just and the account of all his acungs and doings therein , when thereto required said , and if it shall hereafter appear , that any last will and testament was made by the deceased , and the same be proved in court , and letters testamentary or of administration be obtained thereon , and the lest Tucker do , in such case , on being required thereto , render and deliver up the letters of administration grant to him as aforesaid ; and shall general , do and to it in time to time be require of him by law , then this obligation to be void , Know Elisha ! Tuck John Perkins !
